

I. APPLE NEWS

A. Apple reports fourth quarter results iPhone revenue sets September quarter record Services revenue reaches new all-time high. CUPERTINO, CALIFORNIA- Apple today announced financial results for its fiscal 2023 fourth quarter ended September 30, 2023. The Company posted quarterly revenue of \$89.5 billion, down 1 percent year over year, and quarterly earnings per diluted share of \$1.46, up 13 percent year over year.

"Today Apple is pleased to report a September quarter revenue record for iPhone and an all-time revenue record in Services," said Tim Cook, Apple's CEO. "We now have our strongest lineup of products ever heading into the holiday season, including the iPhone 15 lineup and our first carbon neutral Apple Watch models, a major milestone in our efforts to make all Apple products carbon neutral by 2030."

B. Apple announces expanded partnership with Amkor for advanced silicon packaging in the U.S.

Today Apple announced it will be the first and largest customer of the new Amkor manufacturing and packaging facility being developed in Peoria, Arizona. Amkor will package Apple silicon produced at the nearby TSMC fab, where Apple is also the largest customer.

"Apple is deeply committed to the future of American manufacturing, and we'll continue to expand our investment here in the United States," said Jeff Williams, Apple's chief operating officer. "Apple silicon has unlocked new levels of performance for our users, enabling them to do things they could never do before, and we are thrilled that Apple silicon will soon be produced and packaged in Arizona."

Apple and Amkor have worked together for more than a decade, packaging chips used extensively in all Apple

products. With a shared desire to manufacture in the U.S., Apple and Amkor developed plans to build the largest outsourced advanced packaging facility in America. Amkor will invest approximately \$2 billion in the project, and upon completion, it will employ more than 2,000 people.

Apple's investments in advanced manufacturing are part of the commitment the company made in 2021 to invest \$430 billion in the U.S. economy over five years. Today Apple is on pace to meet its target through direct spend with American suppliers, data center investments, capital expenditures in the U.S., and other domestic spend.

C. A California school district brings creativity to life with Apple Learning Coach

Something transformative is happening in the Downey Unified School District in Southern California. "There's a buzz," says Allison Box, principal at Lewis Elementary School. Additionally, Apple Learning Coach is expanding to 12 more countries, in addition to the United States, by the end of the year.

E. Forget The New MacBook Pro, Apple Has Something Much Better

Apple continues to support its awkward vision of an entry-level MacBook Pro, yet consumers would be far better off with a MacBook Air. Will the M3 MacBook Pro make a difference, or will it remain a clumsy and inelegant solution?

Update: Sunday December 10. The March 2024 event will not be the exclusive domain of the MacBook. According to the latest reports from Bloomberg, the deskbound computers will be launched alongside not just a new iPad portfolio but also several iPad Pro tablets built around the same M3 Apple Silicon chipset as the MacBook Air laptops.

Before the COVID-19 pandemic, Apple leaned heavily into the idea that the iPad could be your next computer. Marketing pushed the flexibility of the iPad, especially when paired with a keyboard, case, and mouse. The urge to replace equipment such as laptops and the rise of Work From Home during the pandemic's various lockdowns saw MacBook sales rise across the board—sales that were helped by the launch of the M1 Apple Silicon chipset.

How Apple will balance the presentations around its most powerful tablets carrying the same core hardware as its least powerful laptop will be a fascinating balancing act. This could be quite a challenge since Apple is quietly pushing macOS and iPadOS closer to each other for application compatibility.

Why You Should Wait For Apple s New MacBook Air

When Tim Cook and his team debuted the M1 Apple Silicon chipset for Mac, it did so with a MacBook Air, macMini, and MacBook Pro. In terms of selling the change from Intel-based to ARM-based silicon, keeping the same portfolio made marketing sense.

Yet the increased performance, endurance, and potential of the M1 meant that the M1 MacBook Air vastly outperformed even high-end Intel chipsets. The MacBook

Air was more than enough MacBook for consumers. The slight performance uplift achieved by the MacBook Pro—which was little more than an M1 MacBook Air with a cooling fan—came with a significant price premium.

Perhaps that made sense for a few months, but once the M1 Pro and M1 Max MacBook Pro laptops arrived, there was a simple answer if you needed professional power. The answer for everyone else—and the vast majority of consumers—was the capable MacBook Air.

With the launch of the M2, Apple continued with its awkward low-end MacBook Pro, now made even more awkward due to the increased performance of the M2 chipset.

We now have the M3 chipset. Apple's decision to launch only "Pro" models during Q4 of 2023 means that the low-powered M3 MacBook Pro is the entry-level MacBook for the new chipset. It will remain that way until late March 2024, when the M3 technology will reach the MacBook Air.

It's hard to recommend the M3 MacBook Pro knowing what is coming. Putting aside the ridiculous notion that 8 GB of RAM is acceptable in a laptop costing \$1,599, the effective entry-level model is \$1,799. Undoubtedly, the M3 MacBook Pro will offer more performance than the M3 MacBook Air. Historically, this has been around 15 to 20 percent above the baseline Air, and the baseline M3 will have significantly more potential than the M1 and M2.

Perhaps the only notable change is Apple moving this MacBook Pro towards the same design language as the more powerful MacBook Pro. A 14-inch screen has replaced the 13-inch screen. The extra real estate will be welcomed, but a 15-inch version of the M2 MacBook Air, and Apple is expected to release a 15-inch M3 MacBook Air in March alongside the consumer favourite 13-inch model.

If you want to spend more money on more power, the M3 Pro and M3 Max MacBook Pro models are the best choice. If you want a larger screen than the standard 13-inch, the 15-inch MacBook Air will be the best option. If you want a snappy laptop running macOS, you can't go wrong with the standard 13-inch MacBook Air.

The key argument for the M3 MacBook Pro might be that it's here now, and March is still some time away. And if that's the case, you'd be better off checking Apple's refurb store and picking up the base MacBook Pro with the M2 Pro chipset, which has more power, screen, and potential than Apple's awkward M3 MacBook Pro.

F. Apple Co-Founder Steve Wozniak Becomes

A Serbian Citizen: What Does It Mean For The Tech World?

G. Apple rumored to be switching its Mac accessories to USB-C early in 2024

Apple's accessories could be getting the USB-C treatment

The iPhone 15 made the switch to USB-C this year, but the Lightning port lives on with several Mac accessories. The latest rumor is that these accessories will get updated with USB-C ports in the first half of next year.

This is according to Instant Digital on Chinese social media site Weibo (via 9to5Mac), and "spring 2024" is mentioned. We're assuming that means spring in the northern hemisphere, so March, April, or May.

The tipster mentions the Apple Magic Mouse, the Magic Keyboard, and the Magic Trackpad, though we don't get much information beyond that – it's possible that the switch to USB-C will be the one and only change with the refresh.

Once that happens, there won't be many Apple products left with the Lightning port. The company still says older iPhones of course, and as our iPhone SE 3 review will tell you, that phone has a Lightning port on the bottom of it as well.

A special event?

Another rumor earlier this week suggested that new iPad Air, iPad Pro, and MacBook Air models – all powered by Apple's own M3 chip – could be launching in March, April, or May as well, so it sounds as if there could be quite a lot of new hardware on show.

Apple has launched products in March in the past, though it didn't this year. This year we had the Apple M2 chips and some associated Mac computer refreshes announced in January, with nothing then until WWDC 2023 in June.

What remains to be seen is whether we'll get a full event that gets live streamed over the web – like we did in March 2022, when products including the Mac Studio were announced – or whether Apple will content itself with a flurry of press releases instead.

It makes sense for Apple to slowly phase out the use of Lightning, though we'll never know if the iPhones would have stuck with the port if it wasn't for European Union regulations. It seems Apple's flagship accessories are next in line.

H. Steve Jobs \$4.01 check to RadioShack sold for \$46,063 at auction



Steve Jobs went shopping at RadioShack in 1976, spending a whopping \$4.01 via a signed check — and that check has blown away expectations, hitting \$46,063 at auction.

RR Auction held its Fine Autograph and Artifacts auction from November 17 to December 6. It featured a Science and Technology sale with a signed check from Steve Jobs.

The check was expected to fetch around \$25,000, but ended up closing at \$46,063. The check was written for \$4.01 for a purchase at RadioShack on July 23, 1976.

RadioShack played an important part in the pre-Apple days, as co-founder Steve Wozniak bought the TRS-80 Micro Computer System at the retailer, which he then used to build his "blue box" to make long-distance calls for free.

In the early days of the partnership between Wozniak and Jobs, the pair made and sold around 200 of the boxes for about \$150 apiece.



While Apple is expected to launch a slew of software updates next week, including iOS 17.2 and macOS 14.2, a few smaller firmware updates already arrived this week. As we previously reported, there's another AirPods Pro firmware update—bringing the total this fall to five—and now there's a rare update to the 140-watt power adapter that ships with the 16-inch MacBook Pro.

Before you ask, no, we have no idea what it does. But we do know it brings the version number to 1.4.73 and the build number to 10M5237. Apple doesn't document this kind of firmware update with release notes so we don't know what bug fixes or features it brings, but according to Aaron613 on X, who tracks software and firmware updates, it's the first time Apple has updated the 140-watt charger since it debuted alongside the 16-inch MacBook Pro in 2021.

Apple ships all 16-inch MacBook Pros with the 140-watt power adapter, which is needed for fast charging along with the supplied USB-C to MagSafe 3 Cable. On the newest M3 models, fast charging is

also available with Apple's 240W USB-C Charge Cable, so the update may be related to that new functionality.

There's no way to force your charger to update. The power adapter will update when plugged in and attached to your MacBook, but there's no guarantee it will do it today. To check your firmware version, go to the *General* tab in *System Settings*, then click *About* and scroll down to *System Report*. Then click the *Power* tab and scroll down to *AC Charger Information*.

VI. Tips & Tricks

A. Customize Screenshots - Macs

have a lot of built-in customization options for screenshots. When you use shift + command + 4 to take a sized screenshot, hold option when dragging to resize all four corners, and space bar to move the selection box.

B. Delete by Line -

To delete an entire line, hold down the command key and then press the delete button.

C. Delete by Word -

When you're writing, you can edit more efficiently with keyboard commands. To delete an entire word at once instead of character by character, hold down the option key and then press the delete button.

D. Hide Menu Bar Date - Don't want to see

the date? go to System Preferences, select Dock & Menu Bar, and then under the Clock heading on the left menu, deselect "Show day of the week" and "Show date."

E. Automatically Hide and Show Menu

Bar - To automatically hide and show your menu bar, go to System Preferences, select Dock & Menu Bar, and then choose "Automatically hide and show menu bar on desktop."

F. Always Show Scroll Bars

To keep your scroll bars visible at all times, open up System Preferences, select General, and then under the "Show scroll bars" option, choose "Always."

G. Talk to and listen to your Mac!

Way back before macOS Sierra launched in 2016, the Mac's ability to listen to you and talk back was already impressive through Dictation. However, that's been completely topped by Siri's arrival on Apple's Mac lineup.

You can either hold down Command and Space for a couple seconds, or simply click the Siri button on your Dock or Menu Bar, and summon the same Siri you've grown accustomed to on your iPhone. And, if you have a newer Mac, like the 2018 MacBook Pro, you can just say 'Hey Siri'. And, as a bonus, this version of Siri is much more useful.

Beyond the questions you may usually ask, like the weather or who's playing in the playoff game, Siri on macOS Mojave and Catalina can toggle system functions like Wi-Fi or Bluetooth, or even pull up individual files stored on the system, based on what you tell Siri about the file. Siri can even launch apps for you.

Just press Command+Space and get to asking.

H. Type exotic characters

In addition to all the letters and symbols you see on your keyboard, you'd be surprised at the bewildering array of special characters you can type on your Mac. You may already be familiar with typing accents such as for café (in which case you type either Option+E then E again or, on OS X 10.7 or later, hold down the E until you get extra options) but you'll find there are many, many more.

Go to the Edit menu of most apps and you'll see Special Characters at the bottom. This panel gives you access to a huge range of symbols you can drag into your documents. Not all apps or operating systems support them, but these are mostly part of the cross-platform Unicode standard. There are probably more than you see at first, too; click the cog to reveal more.

Emoji (those fun, colourful characters available in OS X 10.7 or later) are a notable exception to this cross-platform world. They're not Apple-only, but your recipient might not be able to see them.

I. Sign PDFs right in Mail

It might be the 21st century, but we're still using squiggles on a piece of paper to agree to all manner of things. If you are emailed a PDF to sign, though, you don't have to faff about printing it, signing it, then scanning it back in: you can actually sign it right in Mail.

Drag a PDF into the email you're sending, hover over it then at the top right you'll see a little button appear. Click it, and you get a range of Markup options, including one for signing documents. What's more, you can either add your signature by holding a signed piece of paper up to the webcam on your Mac – and it does a fantastic job of cutting it out of the background – or by drawing on your trackpad.

Got an iPad stylus? Try using that instead of your finger!

J. Share easily with friends

In various places in OS X and macOS you see the option of sharing things to friends and contacts from a little Share button that looks like an arrow going up out of a box. The best bit, though, is that Macs keep track of how and to whom you most often share stuff.

So, if you're in the habit of sharing funny links with a friend and AirDropping files to a colleague sitting next to you, these options will get stuck to the bottom of the share menu to make it easy to pick those options next time.

K. Use Split Screen

Working with two windows or apps side-by-side became much easier since OS X 10.11 El Capitan, thanks to Split Screen view. If you're still on macOS Mojave or older, you can hold down a left-click on an app's green maximize button in the top-left hand side, then drag it to be positioned on the left or right-hand side of the display.

If you have macOS Catalina installed, it's a bit different. You simply left-click and hold on that green maximum button, which brings out a dropdown menu in which you can choose to Enter Full Screen, Tile Window to Left of Screen, or Tile Window to Right of Screen. In addition, if you've got a secondary screen, this menu will also give you the option to move the active window to that screen.

Whichever way you do it, you'll then need to pick a second open window or app to snap to the opposite side. Split Screen obscures the launcher and OS X's Menu Bar, so you get a bit more screen real-estate and fewer distractions.

Dividing the separating line between the two apps lets you make them smaller or larger, though not by much. However, this can come in handy for keeping an eye on live information such as sports scores at one end while being productive on the other.

L. Annotate PDFs and images

Preview is an incredibly powerful tool, and it'll only get more powerful in macOS Mojave. Beyond letting you, well, preview PDFs and images, Preview allows for a ton of annotations for PDF that are compatible with Adobe's PDF app, Acrobat, which is used by Windows users and companies — making it easy to share annotated documents with colleagues, regardless of the platform they use.

Make sure the Edit Toolbar is visible (from the View menu) and you'll see you've got options for drawing shapes, arrows, speech

and thought bubbles and more. There's also the option to highlight text in different colours, strikethrough some text, add notes and type some text into boxes.

M. Email huge files

Email isn't really meant for file transfer, but — let's be honest — we all do it. Problem is, many email providers flat-out won't let you send attachments over a particular size (often only a few megabytes) so sending large files over email is usually a no-no.

With Mail since Yosemite, though (and in fact with the webmail version of Mail at icloud.com), you can email files up to 5GB in size. What in fact happens is that the attachment really gets uploaded to iCloud, and then a link is sent to your

recipient where they have 30 days from which to download it.

(If your recipient is using Mail on Yosemite/icloud.com, they'll probably just see the attachment in their email client as usual rather than being shown a link.)

N. Paste With Style Matching -

When pasting something, if you use Option-Shift-Command-V instead of just Command-V, you can transform the pasted content into the style of the content that already exists in a document. If you have a block of text that's bold, for example, and then want to paste in text from the web and make it bolded too, you can use this keyboard shortcut.

O. Transfer Files Fast -

If you hold down "T" when your Mac is booting up, you can enter Target Disk Mode. In this mode, use a Thunderbolt 3 cable to transfer large files at fast speeds between two Macs.

P. Split your screen for multitasking

This is another tip that I find super handy because it allows you to work in two apps side by side at the same time. For example, you could have Mail open on one side of your screen and be writing a document on the other. To enter Split Screen View:

Hover your cursor over the green icon in the top left of the application you want on one side of the screen.

Then choose from one of these three options: Enter Full Screen, Tile

Window to Left of Screen, and Tile Window to Right of Screen.

Choose either the left or right option, then select a secondary app to use on the other side.

To exit the Split Screen view, tap on the green button in the top left corner of the app you want to close.

This tutorial will walk through the steps required to get pictures from your iPhone to your computer, without using iCloud.

How to Transfer Pictures from iPhone Without iCloud to Mac


This process will copy the photos from iPhone to the Mac, without using iCloud, and instead rely on the bundled Image Capture application to complete the transfer:

- 1. Connect the iPhone to the Mac with a USB cable
- 2. Choose "Allow" when requested to have access to the USB device, this is your iPhone



3. Open the "Image Capture" application, from the / Applications folder, or by hitting Command+Spacebar to bring up Spotlight and typing "Image Capture" and hitting return

- 4. Select your iPhone from the left side menu in Image Capture
- 5. Optionally, choose a specific destination on the Mac by clicking on the 'Import to' dropdown menu, or accept the Pictures folder default
 - To transfer all the photos from iPhone, click the "Download All" button in the bottom right corner
 - To copy select photos from iPhone to Mac, select each picture and choose "Download" in the bottom right corner



 Let the photo transfer complete, the pictures will be in the destination folder (default as user Pictures/ directory) when finished

USB file transfer for photos is relatively fast, but depending on the number of photos and/or length of videos you're copying, it may take a few minutes or longer.

Using Image Capture is one of the simplest and most direct ways to copy photos from an iPhone without using iCloud, but you can also use the Photos app (without or with iCloud Photos enabled on the Mac, the app can still manage photos), Preview app, and multiple third party apps too.



VII. Miscellaneous A. DVDs are making a comeback

Drama-rama is a risky business

The Discovery-Warner Bros. merger has stirred up a bunch of licensing issues. Max lost 87 titles, including the still-popular "Westworld." And say goodbye to "Mythbusters," "Minx" and "Legendary." This means if you bought these titles on Max, you can no longer watch them.

The sci-fi drama and other axed programs are available for free (with ads) on Roku and Tubi, but the point remains: Just because you bought a show or movie doesn't mean it's yours to watch forever.

Companies are cutting shows and movies from streaming services to save money on paying residuals to actors and writers, so who knows what you'll lose next? Enter the second rise of the Blu-ray.

Say no to digital

When I look at the rack in my home theater at my new house, there's a Blu-ray player. When the AV nerds asked me if I wanted one, I figured, "Why not?" Turns out a lot of other people are doing the same thing now.

Folks are doubling down on collecting DVDs, Blu-ray discs and other physical media of their favorite shows and movies. For a while, it was just niche hobbyists and film snobs. Now, ordinary people are dusting off the old DVD player.

It's not just old movies, either. This year's "Barbie" movie even has a special edition Blu-ray with a pink case. They wouldn't make it if folks weren't buying.

Want to go old-school?

- Buy super-affordable collections: You can now buy multiple movies on one DVD. For example, get the complete eight-film "Harry Potter" collection (\$23.98), eight wartime comedies (\$4.99), eight flicks starring The Rock (\$16.96) or Universal's 10-film action collection (\$19.99). Find more collections here.

- Keep your eyes open for deals: Record stores, public libraries (if you want to rent) and, of course, the internet are all good places to start. You can find almost anything you'd like to watch for sale on Amazon, eBay or Facebook Marketplace.

■ **Shop secondhand:** Cruise by a garage sale or check your local secondhand shops. You never know what gems you'll find.

You could also start swapping movies with family and friends.
